For Principal Investigators & RCUH Employees regarding Return to the Workplace and Telework

This advisory, the tenth in the series of RCUH advisories providing guidance to PIs and RCUH employees as the University of Hawai'i prepares to re-open for the 2021 Fall Semester.

July 23, 2021 University of Hawai'i Announcement Rescinds the University's August 3, 2021 Return to Work Guidelines

On July 23, 2021, the University of Hawai'i's administration [announced that it has rescinded its May 21, 2021 announcement](#), which would have required all University of Hawai'i employees to return to their workplaces by August 3, 2021, and end its allowance for telework. This rescindment allows employees to continue to telework, but it also requires all work units and work locations to ensure "staffing sufficient for full in-person support and services."

The RCUH supports the University's decision. However, RCUH employees may still be required to return to their workplace if directed by their Principal Investigator. The RCUH supports continued telework depending on the Principal Investigator's and Project's on-site staffing needs.

RCUH Core Offices

The RCUH Core Offices will continue on-site work/operations at the Burns Hall/East West Center Building and the Manoa Innovation Center. Access remains restricted to employees only at the Burns Hall/East West Center through at least October 18, 2021.
